It can also be mailed to International Ice Patrol, 1 Chelsea St. New London, CT 06339
What happens when complete information is received?	The results of the survey may lead to policy changes or product delivery updates which may enhance the Coast Guard's overall operations. Results will be published in the International Ice Patrol's annual report and on the IIP website.
